What is IIT JEE?

The **JEE** is a national-level engineering entrance conducted by the National Testing Authority. JEE aspirants will get all the necessary information for JEE on this page. The JEE Main syllabus is not yet out. But it will be mostly the same as the old syllabus. The NTA may release the JEE Main application form in November 2022. Students should check the <u>JEE Main eligibility criteria</u>. The official notification of JEE dates is not released yet. Candidates who cleared JEE Main will be eligible for JEE Advanced 2023.

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Clearing the JEE Main is not an easy task. It needs hard work and proper planning to score better marks in the JEE Main exam. Those who clear the JEE exam can join the best engineering institutions in India, like IITs, NITs, and more.

JEE Exam Categories

The JEE 2023 has two stages: <u>JEE Main</u> and <u>JEE Advanced</u>. JEE Main is the first part of the entrance exam. The next phase of IIT JEE is the JEE Advanced exam. Since the competition level is high, it is very important that students should prepare and plan effectively to crack the exam. More information regarding JEE Main and JEE Advanced is given below.

JEE Main

The preliminary stage of the JEE is the JEE Main 2023. The JEE Main 2023 exam dates are not yet out. The admission to IIITs, NITs, and CFTIs is based on the ranks scored in the JEE Main.

JEE aspirants can appear for both sessions. The best score from the two sessions will be taken for eligibility for JEE Advanced. The exam consists of three papers. Students have to attempt paper 1 for B.Tech. To get admission to B.Arch. programmes, they should attempt paper 2A. For B.Planning courses, paper 2B is required. Maths, Physics, and Chemistry are the subjects included in the JEE syllabus. The JEE Main registration process is expected to start in November.

JEE Advanced

The JEE Advanced is expected to be held in June. The top 2,50,000 candidates from the JEE Main will qualify to appear for JEE Advanced. JEE Advanced is the second stage of JEE. The name of the organising IIT is not yet published officially. Also, the revised <u>JEE Advanced syllabus</u> is out.

Students are provided admission to B.E. or B.Tech. courses in 23 IITs and 9 other premier institutes. The exam is a computer-based test (online) with two papers. The exam is conducted in two shifts a day. Both paper 1 and paper 2 are compulsory. To be on the merit list, students have to clear both.
